

Day 1 **Leviticus 19:1-18 and Matthew 5:43-48**

What do these laws tell us about how God intends people to live with one another? How do we struggle to do this? In Matthew 5, how does Jesus take these commands in Leviticus 19 further? What does that say about what God is doing through Jesus? How does this challenge you?

Day 2 **Deuteronomy 15:1-11 and Acts 4:32-35**

Deuteronomy 15 records God's commands for what is known as the Year of Jubilee. What is supposed to happen on this day? What does this teach us about the heart of God? There is no recorded history of the people actually putting this command into practice. However, how does the early church put it into practice in Acts 4? What does this say about how the church is supposed to function?

Day 3 **Isaiah 1:1-20**

This is a sobering passage, but in order for us to do what is right we first have to identify how we have it wrong. This was originally a word of correction to the people of Israel, but how can it also apply to the church of today? How does this challenge you in your own life? What is the promise that God makes to his people in the midst of this rebuke? How does this encourage you?

Day 4 **John 15**

What does this passage teach us about the character of God revealed to us in Jesus? In a world that struggles to love one another, how are the followers of Jesus to demonstrate something different?

Day 5 **Titus 3**

What does it mean to be, "justified by his grace"? According to this passage, how is the "kindness and love of God" supposed to change how we interact with the people around us? How are you caught up in "foolish controversies"? What needs to happen in your own life to live more in line with this teaching?

Day 6 **1 John 4:7-21**

What is your favorite part of this passage? Why? How should "knowing and relying on God's love for us" and loving because "He first loved us" impact the way we love one another? How does this make loving others more challenging? How does it improve our love for one another?

Day 7 **Luke 10:25-37**

In what ways are you struggling to demonstrate "neighbor love"? Who is someone that is hard for you to love? What would it look like for you to demonstrate "Christ's love" in this situation and to this person?
