



COMFORT: THE ENEMY OF CALLING

Wednesday, March 15 | Genesis 12:1-9

Do our decisions reflect that we trust God? Abram demonstrates how barriers can be broken when we trust that the promises of God are true and absolutely in our favor. Abram had the courage to be boldly obedient with God's plan even if he had no idea where he would end up. Can you imagine the conversation we would have with God if he told us to leave our home at 75, and go to a location that He is not ready to reveal yet? Would comfortability steal our calling or would we go like Abram? Today the unknown is a bigger barrier than ever before. The unknown is easily known with the access we have to information at our fingertips. At times the need to trust God's promises for us exists outside of the knowledge we can so easily attain, leaving us curious of what God's plan is, but not motivated to move. I imagine Abram would agree that if we wait for the day we 'feel' motivated to move, then we may wait forever. Abram was clear on where he put his trust, which was in God's promises to him; not the fear of the unknown. He went on his journey because he trusted-- not doubted-- that God would deliver on his promise. When we allow doubt and fear of the unknown to decide our path, they become thieves of the abundant life God has promised to each of us.

Does where and what you want to be differ from what God wants for you? When you look at decisions that you have made, or decisions you are making, are you seeing a reflection of your trust in God's promise to give you abundant life? Or do you see doubt?

You may have a comfortable plan for your life, but God has something greater... a calling.

Prayer: Father, Show me where you want me to go, what you want me to do, so that you may use me fully. Please give me the courage to be boldly obedient when you say 'Go'.

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
