Monday

Proverbs 15:30/Proverbs 25:25

Consider reading these two verses over and over throughout the day. Continually write in your journal all of the names who come to mind who could use some Good News. Continually pray, asking God to equip and embolden you to share the needed Good News, including inviting them to join you for our big celebration this weekend.

Tuesday

2 Timothy 4:5/Luke 4:14-21

Jesus, Paul, and Timothy shared a common life mission statement. Work to summarize in one to two sentences what you hope your legacy to be. This will help you formulate your own life mission statement.

Wednesday

John 4:1-26

Pay careful attention to how Jesus engaged with the Samaritan woman. What are the lessons in this encounter that might help you share the Good News with someone? Please pray for many to accept the invitation to join us this week for worship and our fun celebration. Who are you inviting?

Thursday

Genesis 4:1-9/Luke 10:25-37

Reflect on the past seven days and journal all of the needs among your "neighbors" that you could have met. Pray asking God to help you better notice needs in real time as they occur.

Friday

Matthew 25:31-46

Is there anything in this passage that disturbs, excites and or challenges you? If so, what and why? Who have you been missing in worship or your small group or your serving team? Pray for them and consider reaching out to them in some way in the next 24 hours. Remember to invite someone to our weekend celebration.

Saturday

2 Timothy 4:6-9

Paul makes 3 confident life declarations. Like Paul are you fighting the "good fight" or are there some "fights" that are no longer worth your time? Are you still in the race or are you sitting back watching others serve and grow? How are you daily practicing your faith? Journal your responses.
