

# Colossians: ReThink | Grace

**Monday** **Colossians 1:2 | Romans 1:1-7 | I Corinthians 1:1-3 | II Corinthians 1:1-2**  
Grace to you. What is the difference between the grace and peace given by the world and that which is given by “God and the Lord Jesus Christ?” What do you think the people of these churches ‘felt’ when they heard the opening words of Paul’s letter?

**Tuesday** **Colossians 1:2 | Galatians 1:1-5 Ephesians 1:1-3 | Philippians 1:1-2**  
Grace to you. Who do you know that exudes God’s grace and peace as soon as you first see them? Reflect upon the most common way you greet people when seeing them during the day or sending an email. How could you adjust your greeting so others might experience God’s grace and peace?

**Wednesday** **Colossians 1:3-8**  
Grace for you. What is your “understanding” of how God’s grace impacts a person’s life? When did you first truly “understand” God’s grace? What is the “fruit” that God’s grace bears?

**Thursday** **Ephesians 2:1-10**  
Grace for you. Reread verse 5. What does “it is by grace you have been saved” mean to you? What prevents you from totally receiving and living into this gift? Describe how you are “God’s handiwork.”

**Friday** **Colossians 4:5-6**  
Grace through you. What is an outsider? Who are the outsiders in your circles of influence? If you were on trial for being a grace giver to outsiders, would there be enough evidence to convict you? Explain. How will you speak grace to them the next time you connect?

**Saturday** **II Corinthians 12:1-10**  
Grace through you. Who are the people you find it difficult to give grace and why? What are the “weaknesses” God might be trying to heal in you by having them in your life? Commit to giving the “thorns” in your flesh grace next week.

**Sunday** **Colossians 4:18/I Corinthians 15:1-10**  
Grace with you. How might your daily life be different if you lived with the constant awareness God’s grace is always “with you?” Are you okay if some of your hopes and dreams never become reality? What does “God is writing a story of grace with my life” mean to you?
