Monday

Romans 6:1-2

Reflect: How would you describe being “dead to sin?” In what ways do you guard yourself from being overcome by sin?

Prayer: I am a sinful, broken person in need of your saving and life-changing grace. Help me. Heal me. Change me.

Tuesday

Romans 6:1-3

Reflect: What does it mean to you to be baptized into the death of Jesus? The hope we find in Jesus begins when we admit we have some pain, some brokenness, some behaviors we can't overcome by ourselves. What do you need God to help you overcome?

Prayer: I surrender, God. I can't grow or change without your help. Help me. Heal me. Change me.

Wednesday

Romans 6:4-5

Reflect: Paul says in verse 4 that you can “live a new life.” What is the connection between the resurrection of Jesus, your baptism, and the new life that is yours to claim? Jesus can change anything for anyone and everyone. What are you still needing Jesus to change?

Prayer: God, I can't. You can. I'll think I'll let you. Help me. Heal me. Change me.

Thursday

Romans 8:11

Reflect: How does the resurrection of Jesus provide hope for our “mortal bodies?” What in your life do you need or want Jesus to bring back to life?

Prayer: God of resurrection power, release your power in me. Help me. Heal me. Change me.

Friday

Luke 15:1-7

Reflect: What does the Parable of the Lost Sheep teach us about the nature of God's love and His attitude towards those who stray away from him? What is your application when it comes to your view of those who live messy lives?

Prayer: God of new beginnings, use One More Celebration weekend to bring honor to your name as many are connected to your saving love.

Saturday

Luke 15:8-10

Reflect: Why do you think Jesus chose to compare God's love to that of a woman searching for a lost coin? What does this parable reveal about the value God places on every human life?

Prayer: Thank you, God, for using Pathway Church to connect others with your perfect love.

Sunday

Luke 15:11-31

Reflect: What does this parable teach us about the character of God? How do you see yourself in this parable?

Prayer: God of new beginnings, may our worship on One More Celebration weekend bring joy to your heart as we shout and rejoice when your daughters and sons come home to you.
