Life Steps

Monday

Genesis 1:1-2 | John 1:1-2

Reflect: Come closer, not just clearer. Instead of trying to solve the mystery of the Trinity, take some time to sit with God relationally. Journal or pray using the simple question, "God, who are you?" Be open to whatever the Holy Spirit reveals.

Prayer: Triune God, thank you for making yourself known to me.

Tuesday

John 14:15-26

Reflect: Remember each person of the Trinity. Try praying to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit in turn. Notice how each conversation draws out different aspects of God's love and character. Notice how this deepens your relationship with God.

Prayer: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, thank you for making yourself known to me.

Wednesday

John 17:23

Reflect: The Father loves you like he loves Jesus. How does that change how you see yourself? Choose one habit or mindset to shift this week, so it reflects what the Holy Spirit just revealed to you.

Prayer: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, help me to live into the love that you have for me.

Thursday

John 17:20-26

Reflect: Know the Triune God. Jesus prays for unity among his followers, but he is grounded in the perfect unity of the Trinity. What stands out to you about how Jesus describes his relationship with the Father and how He includes us in that same love?

Prayer: Triune God, by the power of your love, make me one with those who are counting on me and with those whom you have called me to share the Good News. Amen

Friday

1 John 4:7-12

Reflect: Replicate God's love. John reminds us that we love because God first loved us. How can your understanding of God as Trinity shape how you love others this week? How does it push you towards community instead of isolation?

Prayer: God of the Holy Trinity, who is three in one, who is and was and who is to come, make yourself known to me and use me as an instrument of your love today and every day.

Saturday

Romans 8:14-17

Reflect: Rest in the Spirit. Paul writes that the Spirit testifies we are God's children. When you are feeling anxious, unworthy, or alone, how can you return to this truth?

Prayer: Write a short prayer declaring your identity as God's beloved child.

Sunday

Luke 15:11-24

Reflect: What does this story teach you about the love of God?

Prayer: God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit, call out to your people, nudge them to join me in worship today. And as we praise you, speak, heal, and nourish our souls.
